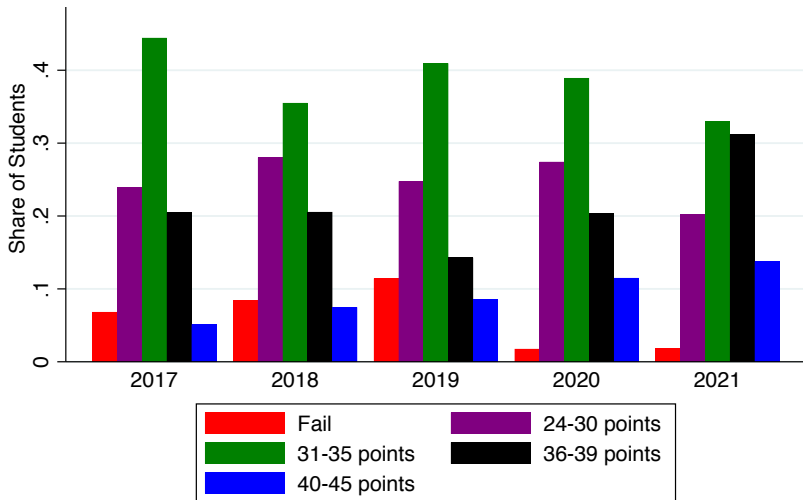

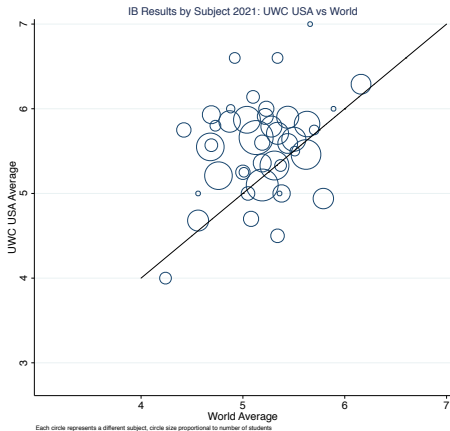
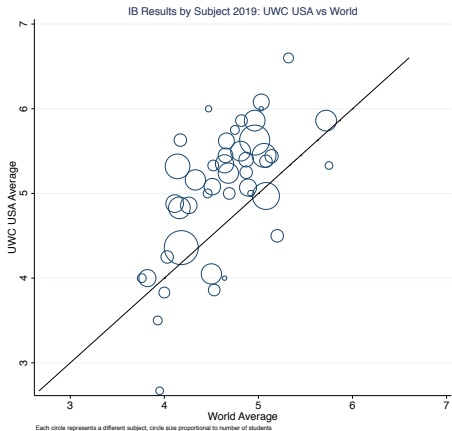
IB Results 2017-2021: UWC USA Grade Distribution



IB Results 2017-2021: UWC USA Grade Distribution

- Average IB score
 - ▶ 2015: 35
 - ▶ 2016-2019: 33
 - ▶ 2020: 34
 - ▶ 2021: 35
- Important drop in number of students who failed
- Overall improvement in grade distribution
- Caveats
 - ▶ Covid years
 - ▶ No IB examinations
 - ▶ Lack of comparison with other UWCs

IB by Subject: UWC USA vs All World



IB by Subject: UWC USA vs All World

- Average grades (weighted by number of students)
 - ▶ 2019: UWC-USA 5.1 vs World 4.6
 - ▶ 2021: UWC-USA 5.5 vs World 5.2
- Advantage of UWC-USA has very slightly eroded
 - ▶ 2019-2021: UWC-USA improved by 0.4
 - ▶ 2019-2021: World improved by 0.6
- Analysis might be useful to identify both potentially problematic and very well functioning courses
 - ▶ Compare over time
